



#### Who are County Committee Members?

- They are unpaid elected officials who serve a two-year term.
- They must reside in the assembly district in which they are elected.
- Each election district has two to four elected county committee positions.
- Some election districts require one male and one female committee member.

#### What do County Committee Members Do?

Duties/Opportunities Entrusted To County Committee Members Include:

- Selecting candidates for elected offices
- Adopting platforms
- Filling certain vacancies in elected offices
- · Organizing campaigns
- May provide a source of government appointees

#### Why is it Important?

Due to the very high concentration of Democrats in New York City, the Democratic Party is a critical institution with a great deal of influence over who gets selected as candidates in elections and ultimately, government policy. By bringing many more young people in to fill these open seats, we can strengthen the Democratic Party and ensure its responsiveness to the issues that are important to us.

#### **How do New York Judicial Elections Work?**

At first glance, New York's method of electing judges to its majeral court — confusingly referred to as the supreme court — is nothing extraordinary.

The process begins during the September primaries. In each sembly district, voters elect judicial delegates, residents whose sole job is to represent the reighborhood at a party nominating convention held a few weeks later. At these twentions, which unite delegates from the various assembly districts within a larger judy district, the delegates cast votes to determine which judicial candidates will appear as a larger judy array's nominees on the general election ballot. Voters then elect judges to 14-year array in the November election.

It all sounds highly democratic, but the public agement allegedly present in New York's system is in fact an unfulfilled promise. In retail the system entrusts the selection of judges neither to the voting public nor to elected als. Instead, unaccountable political party leaders control every step of the process

First, most delegates are handpicked by their county's party officials and do not even appear on the ballot because they almost always run unopposed. According to the state Board of Elections, only one of the 11 assembly districts in the Bronx featured a contested delegate election this year. This means that voters often have no chance to pick who represents them at the conventions.
